SAFE HAVEN—Only a 28-hour flight stands between little Peter Hertz and the promise of a bright new future in the United States as he enjoys his first

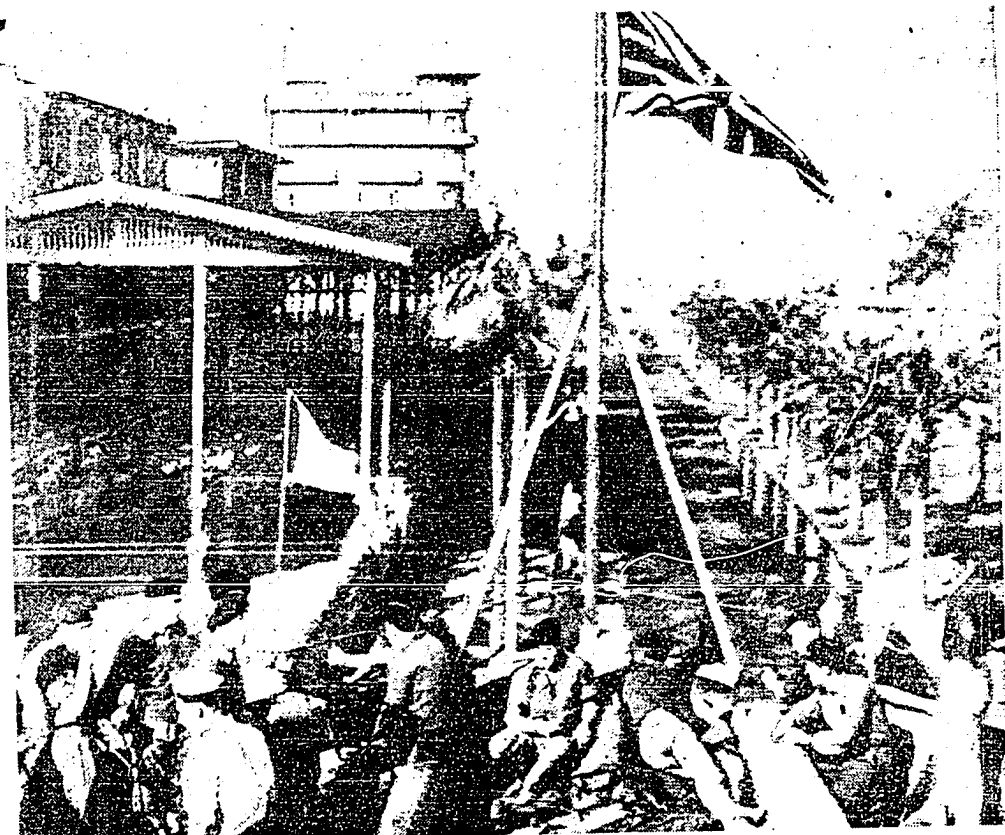
American food at Hungarian refugee camp in Munich, Germany. This is the story of Operation Safe Haven, which is flying 500 persons a day to their new home.
